

The word Lundy is Old Norse—Lund, “puffin”, ey “Island”—and the Island has known many occupiers during its long and often rebellious history.

Its Postal Services are also unusual. As there is now no British Post Office on the Island, the then Owner, the late Mr. Martin Coles Harman, conceived the idea of introducing his own “Local” Stamps, which would be affixed to all outgoing and incoming mails.

This was in 1929, and ever since that time, Local stamps have been issued by this unusual little island, where its inhabitants pay no taxes and there are no licensing laws.

The present owner, Mr. Albion Harman is continuing to issue Local stamps, so there will be no break in continuity of issue for more than 29 years.

More and more collectors are finding increasing interest is to be obtained from the stamps of Lundy, and even as a “sideline” collection, these stamps provide a change from the regular issues of the Colonial Office.

In spite of the fact that these local stamps are not listed by the principal Catalogue publishers in this country, collectors can obtain a comprehensive illustrated and Priced Catalogue, price 5/- from the Publisher, who also holds one of the best stocks of Lundy stamps in this country.

Mini-Mail-Auction of Lundy Literature

All bids are to be made in US dollars on a plain sheet of paper. Bidding increments are 25c on bids up to \$10, and 50c on bids above \$10. Lots will be sold at a single advance over the second highest bid. If there is only one bid on a lot, it will be reduced by 20%.
