EXPERIMENTAL POSTAL SERVICE

Extract from Puffin No. 3.

"1929 - From March to November, an experimental postal service existed - the purpose being to determine the best method of starting the new Local service, and  $\frac{1}{2}$ p., 1p., 6p., 9p., 12p. values were used by Mr. Harman exclusively; the first Lundy postmark was used to cancel this mail. None were sold prior to issue date, but were used on an official basis ONLY between Mr. Harman and Lundy. "


W.R. Rowcroft, Jr.

Extract from Puffin No. 5.

"THE LUNDY EXPERIMENTAL POSTAL SERVICE (March 1929 to Nov 1 1929);  
by W. Rowcroft Jr.

Upon receiving the first lot of Lundy locals the late Mr Harman decided to try them out prior to the issue date and find out the best method of handling this new Postal Service. He estimated that about two complete sheets (240 stamps) of the half and one Puffin and a half-sheet (60) of the other values were used and cancelled during this experimental period. No charges were collected but stamps were affixed to mail and cancelled."

Miss Moon sent me a specimen on piece. (Mr Rowcroft said it was one of those he obtained from Mr Harman)



Nine Puffin - Dated March 10th 1929

Then Mr Rowcroft sent me specimens of the  $\frac{1}{2}$ p and 1p. given to him by Mr M.C. Harman several years before his death, and were found when he was going through old records he had.

Mr Rowcroft also sent a list of the dates he had seen.


I mentioned to Mr Rowcroft the unlikelihood of the 6, 9 and 12 puffin stamps being printed more than a year in advance and he replied "He (Mr M.C. Harman) made mention that he received some sheets from the printers as advance printing copies, but never did say what values they were."

Another note from Mr Rowcroft says :

" I have run across a notation in my collection from late Mr Harman stating that he gave some of the stamps used prior to issue date to friends, on cover and he kept some cut to size to show stamp and postmark."

UNOFFICIAL ROTARY OVERPRINTS

Miss Gladys Moon has provided us with an opportunity of seeing pictures of some of the most elusive Lundy bogus stamps. That is the "unofficial rotary overprints"


Those are from the collection of a member of the Peoria Philatelic Society.

Miss Moon wrote "Here is all I know about the Rotary overprints and I copied it from the invoice my friend got from the New York Airmail dealer."


*"Two airmail values 1p. and 2p. as well as one postage value the 6p. Of these three values one sheet of fifty copies exists. No other values or any other quantities exist. The reason is that it was technically impossible to do the overprinting on a large scale for large quantities due to the fact that the stamps already were gummed, perforated and have a glossy surface. Therefore the project of overprinting quantities was abandoned. The above three values are the only ones existing and, due to the limited quantities, of course were never issued for regular postal use. They are of course very much in demand, all over the world, not only from airmail collectors but by many thousands of Rotary Collectors as well."*

We are specially grateful to Miss Moon for arranging to have photographs of these stamps made, and to Dr. Snellor, past president of the Peoria Philatelic Society for taking them so expertly.

These were originally reported also on the 1951 7puffin value in Puffin 3. We can also deduce that they were an American product as in England we spell "Honoring" as "Honouring".

THE 1936 LARGE MAP STAMPS

These stamps were last mentioned on pages 13 - 20 of Puffin 15, when illustrations of all sheets and a reprint appeared.

The reprint, you will recall was of stamps 3, 7  
8, 1

I thought that that was the end of the story, but at the time I had not examined the "Proofs" which can be found without value. These are imperf and in mauve, green or red.

I have only seen three kinds of pair. - 9, 8. 1, 7. and 7,  
6.


Three of these stamps are also on the Penny reprints.

The stamps I have examined are one mauve pair of my own, and photocopies of <sup>four</sup> pairs from Mr Zon's collection. My pair mauve on white 1, 7. Mr Zon's Red on white 9, 8. : Mauve on blue 1, 7. : Green on white 1, 7. : Mauve on white 7, 6. This is very little evidence, but some conclusions can be drawn from it.

As Proofs they would of course have been printed before the sheets - but these were not. Surely before the reprints then - but no.

They seem to be the last impressions taken from the plates (unless more turn up as they seem to have a habit of doing)


Stamp 1 is the stamp which provides the clue. Since the reprint another dash has dropped off just near the B of BARNSTAPLE

Mr. Rowcroft was able to tell a little more of these "proofs".



Mr Rowcroft said " I purchased some pairs direct from the printers of the issue and along with these a mint set of the issued stamps. This buy was made in 1949 and the printer advised that this group was his file copies and thought he would dispose of them because no further issue was to be printed"

Mr Rowcroft also has the 1/- value in issue colour imperforate with value in the margin.

The 1954 Jubilee Issues - Last mentioned on pages 46 & 47 of Puffin 15.

Since the last Puffin I have obtained a complete set of sheets of those attractive stamps printed by Harrison & Sons. There are 38 sheets to the set.

It seems reasonable to assume that they were printed in sheets of 40 in two panes of 20 and cut in halves before delivery. In any case sheets of all 19 values are to be found perforated through both one or two margins. The sheets are backed in thin tissue paper owing to their having a gum readily affected by dampness.

The Jubilee airmail and definitive airmail have centres printed from the same plates with the exception of the 2 puffin value. For some inexplicable reason separate plates of this value were made. The marginal inscription is on the left on the 2p Jubilee sheets, but on the right on the 2p Definitive sheets.

It is probably possible to plate all these values, but this would entail describing at least 560 stamps, and perhaps 760. Many of these would be only microscopically different, but some are larger and more obvious than the well known "tail on P of Puffin" on the 1/2p Jubilee airmail.

There is a chance here for members to find their own varieties and report them. I have illustrated some I have found, but it is difficult to know where to draw the line. Each collector will have his own ideas about this.

I can supply some of these varieties mint without gum, if anyone has difficulty in obtaining perfect specimens (advertised wholesale elsewhere)



White Stripe in sky behind Blériot & Normal  
(Stamp 9, sheet with two perf margins)

The same variety occurs on the One Puffin Dated Airmail issue as well.

On the half puffin airmail the varieties consist of various additional dots around the background shading to the balloon. As before varieties on the centre plate are common to both Jubilee and definitive airmails.

The other value I have chosen to illustrate is the 2p. surface mail map stamp. Two of these varieties are detectable at a distance. One was the spot behind the Puffin's head mentioned in Puffin 12 which was the stamp which sparked off the whole investigation. The other is a large white blotch in the L of Lundy.







The first ½d. Air View stamp

In Puffin 3. - "½d. Airviews. ½d. violet - no letters in border. Issued 20 - 7 - 1937 and withdrawn the following day. - This stamp was later overprinted. ½d. violet with name in border, issued 22 - 7 - 1937" J.N.Holland.

Mr Downing, in "The Lundy Locals" said "The variety no letters in border was from a first printing, but was never issued as such"  
 "The ... stamps with letters in border ... were issued on the 11th June 1937.  
 However "The ½d. value(Largo Maps) was withdrawn on 20th July 1937.

Mr Dulin, in the commentary to his photographic slides of Lundy Stamps says" 24,000 copies of this design were produced to be the third airmail issue. Mr Harman objected on the grounds that the design implied the air service was run by Lundy. The stamp was not released.



From Mr A.F.Langham, coauthor of "Lundy, Bristol Channel" ( A second edition of which will be available shortly with a revised chapter on "The Stamps of Lundy".)

"You may be interested to know that I have what I think is a unique Lundy stamp. It is one of the issues of 11th June 1937 of which I believe 24,000 were printed but were withdrawn. .... The copy I have is used and came over to Lundy on the first day of issue before Mr Harman had time to intervene. "

In a further letter:

"My airview stamp is unfortunately not on cover. When Mr Gade gave it to me it was attached to a fragment of brown paper which had no markings on it and I am afraid in my ignorance I removed this before mounting the stamp in my collection"

R.M.Willcocks, the stamp dealer, has a cover with such a stamp defaced with a cross in pencil.

Can anyone sort out this muddle of dates? Can anyone prove the issue date of the normal violet airview, with letters in border - a first day cover would help. This would provide a key to the problem.

BOGUS ISSUES

The first Horror was sent to me by Mr Dulin, and by Janet Van don Burg. These are the John F. Kennedy overprints on the very common ½p, 2p (perf) and 9p. forgeries of the stamps cut from miniature sheets.

The overprint (rubber stamped on, by the look of it) occurs upright in violet, black, red, blue and orange. Inverted in the same five colours. Doubled in orange and one violet one orange on all three values. Making 36 horrible labels in all.



The next horrors came from David Stirling and Harry Rooke. The 1929 half Puffin has turned up (probably from different plates to the first forgeries) Both perf. and imperf in brown, and in orange. There are also imperfs in red. I suspect these are all printed singly.

The imperfs have also appeared in blue and two distinct shades of brown overprinted with similar wording to the J.F.K. overprints above, but in different type and with borders. In silver!

The next three doubtful pieces have been described before, but are now illustrated. All are from Harry Rooke's collection.

NEXT PUFFIN



The Red Cross Surtax Stamps

These were previously mentioned on Pages 13 - 15 of Puffin 14.

Mr Ralph L. Stuntzner sent a number of photocopies for the reference collection, among which was a first day cover of the Red Cross issue. This establishes the issue date without doubt. Until this time no members of the Society seemed to know when these stamps were issued.



This cover came from the collection of John Stanard author of "Lundy Island and the Lundy Locals". On the cover he wrote (Too pale to reproduce in the illustration) - "First Day of Issue. With the above overprint (AIR SERVICE TO LUNDY SUSPENDED FOR DURATION OF WAR) I believe to be very rare as only four covers out of 25 I received had same. - John D Stanard."

DATE OF ISSUE - 24th JULY 1940

Mr Dulin has pointed out in his photographic slides of Lundy Stamps a block of three 3p red cross stamps with one Puffin variety. This includes part of the marginal inscription. This meant that I could work out its sheet position - Stamp 24 on the pane - the same as on the lithographed issues although the shape of the pane is different.

This gave me the clue I needed so I bought a block of 2 puffin stamps containing stamp 24, Sure enough it was the Puffin variety here illustrated



SLIDE SHOW "The Stamps of Lundy Island (up to 1942)" made by AUSTIN DULIN

The quality of the 45 slides making up this show is superb. Colours have reproduced perfectly. Obviously the utmost care was taken in the preparation as it is impossible to fault the Commentary neatly provided in book form with a page for each slide. The script is concise yet full of information which should fascinate even General Collectors.

The show includes pictures of the island, first issues mint and used, Tram tickets, Largo maps, A pony largo map bisected and used on a cover from Canada (18th Feb 1937) looks genuine, Airviews mint and on cover, new values, Red Cross issue, Bureau Mail, V and Spitfire overprints and proofs, Fake bisects (16 April 1941) and full titles at beginning and end.

It is the best show either on slide or film strip that I have seen. The commentary is so designed that one slide links up with the next to produce a well coordinated story of the issues of Lundy Stamps up to 1942.





The stamp design of Drawing "A" is mounted on a wooden block 1/8 of an inch thick. To allow for this I have constructed a cardboard album page of the same thickness, with a royal purple surface, and outlined the whole drawing in bright yellow. The effect is indeed, striking.

I have also recess-mounted the whole of drawing "B" on royal purple cardboard. ~~XX~~ This drawing, however, is flat, with a reduced photo of a puffin pasted in the center of the design. (I also have the original photo of this puffin).



The 1939 Intermediate values were issued imperforato. The quantity is not known. Mr Dulin sent a colour slide of the set of three (not in the slide show). The only set I have come across seems to have been issued by the printers on a gilt edged card. Obviously non-philatolic as the stamps are stuck on by their own gum at the top of the stamps.

An interesting way of writing up a collection

Last time I mentioned that Mr Zon had an original way of writing up his collection. (In fact only certain pages). He has taken the pictorial issues, found a photograph or postcard of the same thing, and mounted the two together on the same page. With his immaculate lettering the effect is very pleasing and must make his collection of interest to 'ordinary' philatelists.

Mr Olsson noticed an error on Page 8 of Puffin 14, referring to the bogus miniature shoot. I said "the numeral and words are like the gold overprint". Mr Olsson observed that in fact the IX is different.

On the Gold overprints - ~~IX~~

On the bogus overprints - ~~IX~~

Mr Olsson also has a number of the bogus imperforates, without gum. He has 28 ½p, 7 2p, and 6 9p, and also one used with part of the first Lundy Cancellor.

On the nine puffin he has found three different to the ones listed. On examining his drawings I think it is more likely to be only 1. The illustrations for this article in the last Puffin are so poor that I have to admire Mr Olsson's tenacity in ploughing through it, and actually finding more varieties.



Mr Olsson, like Mr Zon, collects covers to and from Lundy with foreign stamps. He has 150 approximately, including duplicates with different dates. Among his covers is one stamped with ½p., 1p., 6p., 9p., & 12p., + ½d, L.A.C.A.L. and 1½d. G.B. Silver Jubilee dated 1 JAN 1939. Both in Barnstaple and Lundy. The cover is addressed to Swodon.

Another is a "First Transatlantic flight cover" arriving at Lundy 26th May 1939. Mr Stuntzner has sent a photocopy of a similar cover, so maybe I can illustrate it one day.

During 1961 and 2 Mr Olsson says that two cancellors were used on the Europa and Antimalaria issues. One of each is metal and the other rubber. The rubber impressions being thicker. The cancellor in rubber seems to have been used mainly on First Day covers.

Last time I suggested that the "Atlantic" error and "Small B in Bidford" may not exist. Mr Olsson has seen both. I have since seen a number of copies of the Atlantic Error. Its shoot position seems variable. (One could be stamp 30 - one edge imperf). This needs further research. I would like to see a Large Map with small B in Bidford myself.


